As we celebrate the presence and power of the Holy Spirit as well as celebrating the commitment of three of our "iYOUTH" members, **Murray**, **Caitlin and Brooke** who publicly declare their faith in Jesus, through Baptism and Confirmation on this Pentecost Sunday.





Archdeacon Sally writes:

Today we gather to celebrate the signs of God's love among us, as we receive Murray to be Baptised and Caitlin and Brooke who come for Confirmation.

Baptism marks the beginning of a journey with God which continues for the rest of our lives, the first step in response to God's love. It is a joyful moment when we rejoice in what God has done for us in Christ, making serious promises and declaring the faith. The wider community of the local church and friends welcome the new Christian, promising support and prayer for the future.

Hearing and doing these things provides an opportunity to remember our own baptism and reflect on the progress made on that journey, which is now to be shared with these new members of the Church. The service paints many vivid pictures of what happens on the Christian way. There is the sign of the cross, the badge of faith in the Christian journey, which reminds us of Christ's death for us. Water is also a sign of new life, as we are born again by water and the Spirit. This reminds us of Jesus' baptism. And as a sign of that new life, there may be a lighted candle, a picture of the light of Christ conquering the darkness of evil. Everyone who is baptised walks in that light for the rest of their lives.

In Confirmation, we celebrate and make for ourselves those promises that were made on our behalf at our baptism. As you pray for the candidates, picture them with yourself and the whole Church throughout the ages, journeying into the fullness of God's love.

Dear people of Alstonville from Desiree

People are often curious about a new incumbent. In the countdown to my arrival in Alstonville, I thought I would share various aspects of who I am with you.

Who people are and what's important to them is often revealed in their chosen areas of research. To share some of who I am with you, I describe my master's thesis in this article, and my doctorate in the next week's piece.

In one word, my master's thesis is about the ... (do not switch off and become bored when you read the next word – please read to the end – promise me!)

... Trinity! (Carry on reading now, you promised!)

I am in love with the Trinity!

The Trinity is the heart of my experience of faith, any mystical experience of God and the aim of my ministry as a priest.

In short, the Trinity is the Dance of the Divine; Three Persons loving each other so much that they become One. What makes God who God is, is this endless flow of loving and being loved: Source pouring out in love into Christ; Christ receiving that love and pouring love back into Source and the Holy Spirit as the Love Bond uniting Christ to Source and offering us a share in that loving unity.

The most mind explosive, extravagantly generous act is that God opens-up God's inner love life and invites us to live inside that endless dance of love poured forth and love received. As 2 Peter 1v4 asks: "Do you not know that you are partakers of the Divine nature?"

Obviously, this Trinity thing can be a bit esoteric or doctrinal so to communicate my passion for the Trinity clearly, I used Rublev's Trinity Icon to describe the process in which we literally live inside God. The icon (picture) alongside depicts three angels that represent Jesus the Christ (centre), the Holy Spirit (right) and Source (left). A space is left opened in front so that you and I are can accept the gentle hand of invitation from the Spirit to sit at table with the Trinity and allow the endless pouring of love to flow in us and through us. The title of my thesis is "In the Gaze of God: aspects of a theology of Rublev's Trinity Icon.

Thank you for reading this excerpt about one aspect of who I am gleaned 8 from my thesis on Trinity. In the next article, I hope to share more of who I am by writing briefly on my doctorate.
